SEAALL SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT 1989/90

I also submitted to the committee the results of the survey made by the 1988/89 committee and several of that committee's recommendations for changes. I also asked the committee to consider the establishment of a category for a minority scholarship as recommended by Wes Cochran. I received little response to my questions and there was no consensus among the committee members who responded as to what changes if any should be made.

The category for minority scholarship had a favorable response by a couple of members, but it was mentioned that more money should be made available for a special category rather than taking away funds currently available for the scholarship. It also seems that if we are still concerned about increasing participation in the scholarship program as it stands, that further specification will only deter that goal. The award of ten scholarships this year should increase interest next year.
