Dear Carl:

Thank you for the suggestions which were embodied in your letter of May 9th; I am passing them on to Winston Broadfoot, the Chairman of the Committee on Constitution and Codes. I understand that Elaine has already submitted the recommendations of the Committee on Organization to him.

I could not agree more heartily with your proposal with reference to the appointment of committees by the President-Elect, having had such a bad time trying to complete committee rosters in the present biennium. Time was criminally wasted. I am also quite in agreement with the suggestion that no specific fee for the registration of students at conferences be stated. The need for a clearer definition of the procedure for establishing committees and defining their duties is unquestionable.

As for the Committee on Organization, Elizabeth Hughey also believes that it should be considered an ad hoc committee to continue its work until it is completed. For the present, at least until the next meeting of the Executive Board, we can operate on this assumption.
