

Gertrude Mae Morbley (1918-1988), writer of the Colored Notes column from 1962 until 1969 when the practice of formally segregating the news ended at *The Lexington Leader*. Ms. Morbley worked at *The Lexington Leader* as an elevator operator, a reporter and finally a bookkeeper until her retirement in 1981





- Newspapers don't always get it wrong.
- Many times, the information is only in the newspaper.



Pfc. Ruth E. Lyles was the first African American WAC to die in Kentucky during WWII. She was a stock clerk at the Camp Breckinridge warehouse. On June 7, 1944, Pfc. Lyles and Pfc. Lillian Cabbell were walking along the road near the post laundry, when Pfc. Lyles was struck by a military truck driven by Pvt. Joseph H. Austin of the 3800th Quartermaster Company. Pfc. Lyles died at the post hospital. She was from Havre De Grace, Maryland.
