Dear Bill:

Thank you so much for your letter regarding the SE Chapter meeting - we are very pleased that you are interested in membership and that you may attend the meeting.

The SE Chapter Constitution and By-Laws concerning eligibility for membership follow the AALL regulations in general, so that associate membership in AALL is prima facie basis for associate membership in the SE Chapter. We do have a problem that does not arise in other AALL Chapters, and that is that our meetings are held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Southeastern Conference of Law Teachers. This means that only persons connected with the SEC teachers organization or guests of that organization may register and attend their activities, which comprise the major part of the meeting; SEAALL registration is in addition to regular registration. We can only invite you to the AALL luncheon, business meeting and program, we have no authority to introduce non-law school members into the SEC law teachers' meeting.

We will try to resolve this problem as soon as possible, it has not arisen before this year because we had no associate members and the only non-law school members are governmental or private law library librarians, considered quasi-law school. As you would suspect, there are at the meeting representatives of those publishing companies who provide entertainment, but that is a matter for the law teachers conference to decide.

We do not want you to feel that this is in any way a discouragement of your joining us, you know we will be delighted to have you attend our section of the meeting, as well as join us at an informal, unscheduled "Dutch" dinner on Thursday for those who have arrived by then, if you consider these activities sufficient justification for the trip.

As to the details of the meeting, it will be at Holiday Inn-Vanderbilt, on West End Avenue (there are several Holiday Inns), on August 20-22. The program includes a reception Thursday evening, after which we of AALL will go to dinner on our own as mentioned above. Friday morning are SEC panels and lectures, Friday noon and afternoon the SEAALL lunch and meeting, Friday night a dinner, Saturday morning, panels. The panels, lectures, reception and dinner are all SEC Teachers' activities.

Let us hear from you, and we hope you'll come.
