Dear Professor O'Neal:

Thank you for your letter of February 3 advising that the next meeting of the Southeastern Regional Law Teachers Conference will be held in New Orleans August 24, 25 and 26, 1969. As we have in the past, the Southeastern Chapter of the A.A.L.L. will plan to hold its meeting in conjunction with the Law Teachers Conference.

It has been our practice to schedule a short business meeting and one meal-program meeting at a time which would leave our members free to attend most of the other sessions and functions. As soon as I have received the "rough draft" of the program from Professor Crawford, we will proceed to fit our program into the schedule so that it may be incorporated into the final plans.
