- I. **THE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCE** offers to men and women programs of study leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science, which may be begun in September or February. The Courses in Education prepare for the profession of teaching in secondary and higher schools, and grant the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science and a life certificate in Education, entitling the holder to teach in the schools of the State. In this College there are other courses in various fields, and specifically in Journalism, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts in Journalism.

- V. **THE GRADUATE DEPARTMENT** presents advanced courses of study leading to the degrees of Master of Arts and Master of Science.
- VI. **THE SUMMER SESSION** provides college courses for students and teachers which are accredited for the teachers certificate and toward degrees.
- VII. The University maintains laboratories and stations and is well equipped to carry on work in scientific fields. It also has provisions for the care of students.
