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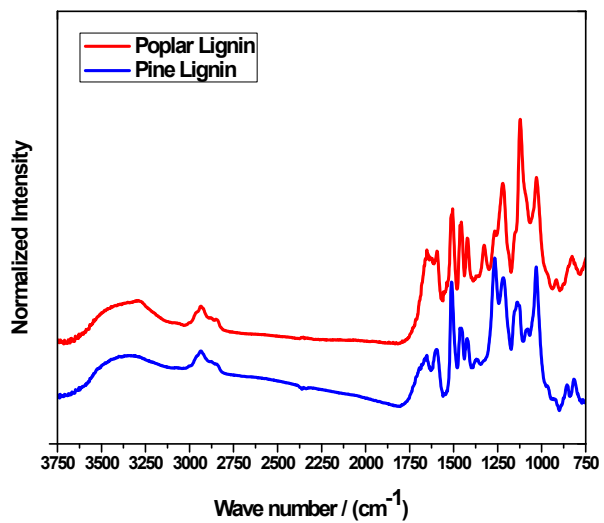


Figure S1. FTIR spectra of pine and poplar derived lignin.

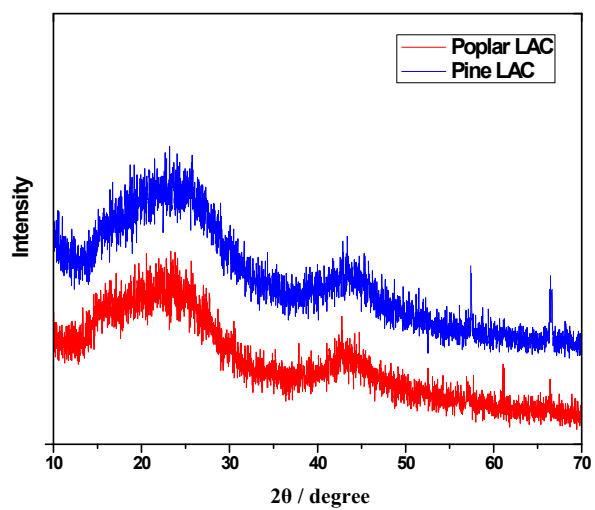


Figure S2. XRD spectra of pine and poplar lignin derived activated carbons.
