Probabilities of identifying data models from random samples drawn from synthetic data with known parameter values based on values derived from the empirical data. For example, reading row one, from left to right, the table says that given synthetic power-law distributions with known parameter values comparable to those derived from the empirical data, there is a 90% chance that the procedure used here would correctly identify them as power-law distributions, a 97% chance that it would identify a power-law distribution in the upper tail, a 0% chance that it would identify a Poisson or geometric distribution, and a 10% chance that it would spuriously fail to find a plausible fit to any of the statistical models under consideration.
